## First West-European Get-together of Telephone Collectors

Belgium has a number of collectors, but there is no real collectors club. However, the collectors all know each other.

Leo De Boeck, the owner of a private telephone museum (www.leofoon.be) came up with the idea to organize a get-together of everybody who is involved in telephone history in Belgium. Jan Verhelst suggested inviting people from neighboring countries. Invitations were issued and thirty-two persons attended the get-together at the Leofoon museum at Steenhuffel, Belgium on August 31st, 2019. They included twenty-three Belgians (fourteen collectors and nine partners) and nine people from neighboring countries (three from Germany, two from the Netherlands, two from the UK, one from Ireland, and one from France).

People, who knew each other by mail, met each other for the first time in real life. Much was discussed and ideas were exchanged.

Andy Emmerson (UK) gave a demonstration of an electronic version of a speaking clock, with samples of a great number of speaking clock voices from all over the world. An electronic speaking clock is an ideal tool for every telephone museum since the electromechanical speaking clocks are difficult to maintain in working order.

Frank Garnier (the Netherlands) gave an explanation about C\*NET, the international telephone network superimposed on the inter-
